OHF COACHES ROLE

- To create a fun and safe experience for the participants for the entire season.
- To develop youth in the game to be great citizens above all else.
- To develop every player on your team to the best of their ability in all aspects of the game.
- To play every player on your team fairly.
- To provide your team with the ability to compete.
- To ensure that every player that plays with you wants to come back and play the next year and ideally wants to play for you.
- Integrity and transparency in your communication and actions to players, parents and officials.
- To work with on-ice officials to create a positive environment.

HC CSAT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ACTION



. Mandatory Training and Certification:

- Update coaching certification programs to include modules on long-term athlete development, inclusivity, and child psychology.
- Require annual evaluations of coaching performance, with input from players and parents.

. Fair Play and Development Prioritization:

- Set clear standards for equitable ice time, especially at younger levels.
- Shift focus from winning to skill-building and teamwork, aligning with ageappropriate goals.

. Behavioral Accountability:

- Establish reporting mechanisms for complaints against coaches, with whistleblower protections.
- Implement a transparent review process to address misconduct and performance concerns.



OHF TAMPERING AND PROGRAM PROMOTION

TAMPERING INCLUDES BUT NOT LIMITED TO

- Talking directly to individual players or representatives of individual players yourself or through others.
- Answer interests by players with interest in them attending your programming and player evaluations.
- Promising players spots on next years teams prior to player evaluations.
- Informing a player they don't have a spot prior to player evaluations.
- Telling a current team that their coaches are returning next year.
- Only providing information directly to players that request details about your programs.
- Operating skates or inviting players to skates to confirm teams.

PROGRAM PROMOTION

- Publicizing the programming that your Association offers to all participants in and outside of your Association.
- Answer questions generally to the programming provided within the Association.
- Abiding by the regulations for announcing information.
- Providing generic responses to requests with redirection to the website or public information.



OHF TAMPERING

No representative of a Team within the OHF, may contact, encourage or invite directly or indirectly a Registered Participant of another team in accordance with G3 (d) and (e) to participate in activities including but not limited to skating parties, conditioning camps, refresher programs, practices, scrimmages or skills sessions that are operated by individuals that are part of the next season's Team or acting on behalf of the next season's Team, inclusive of parents of current or prospective Players, prior to the first day of Player Evaluations for the respective Division. Whereby a representative of a Team within the OHF wishes to contact a Registered Participant after Player Evaluations, they may only do so with having first obtained permission in writing from the Registered Participant's Team. Such written permission shall be in the form of a statement filed with the Team for which the Player is Registered, signed by the designated signing officers of that Team's Association.



OHF TAMPERING

Plain English

Don't talk to players or their parents even if they are on your team about next season until first day of player evaluations.



OHF TAMPERING PROCESS

- Tampering is not a spot in time situation and if no one sees it you get away with it. If after evaluations somebody didn't make your team and the team was formed ahead of time an allegation can be made.
- Tampering will begin with either an allegation or documentation that may indicate tampering occurred.
- A hearing will be established for the coach and any relevant individuals.
- Determination is on balance of probabilities.
- First offence 15 games to 1 year, \$5,000 fine and player cannot play with Association.
- Second offence 10 game to 3 years, \$5,000 fine and player can't play.
- Possible non-participation in Championships or Tournaments.

OHF COACHING ANNOUNCEMENT

- Coaches can be announced by Associations February 15.
- Prior to, Association or Coach can't inform the public or their teams that they will be the coaches for the next year.
- If you are given the position don't let your buddies or friends know prior to February 15.
- Sanctions for non-compliance are 15 games to 1 year for the coaches involved, \$5,000 fine for Association. Players may be exempt from participating.
- Potential of non-participation in Championships or Tournaments.



OHF ASSOCIATION WEBSITES TEAM PAGES

Promotion versus direct and indirect recruitment crossing into tampering.

- Include separate pages for each Team that include:
 - Vision, values and focus of team and coaches after announcement.
 - Programming if known (i.e. skills training, on-ice, off-ice etc.)
 - Teams rules for the players to meet.
 - Schedule and time commitment (i.e. days of week, tournaments etc.)
 - Philosophy on bench and player operations (i.e. PP, PK, shortening of bench, rolling of lines etc.)
 - Include pricing and costs.



OHF FACILITIES RELATIONSHIP

- Facilities are having issues with our programs specifically with relation to respect and compliance of competitive teams (players, parents and coaches).
- Facilities aren't having same issues with other ice users.
- Lack of response or support from Associations and coaches.
- Benefits we expect may get restricted if we don't change (use of facility before games).
- Changing the culture in facilities with our teams and programs.
- Facilities holding programs to Opportunity through OHF to report incidents that they are reporting to Associations for record and understanding of culture they are reporting.
